





Congratulations to our 8th grade girls volleyball team who received an invite to the Elizabeth Seton Volleyball Championships. Since 2006, the Seton Volleyball Championships has served as the largest 8th grade tournament in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. The Seton is volleyball's equivalent to the Padre Serra basketball tournament, bringing together schools from 7 conferences throughout Southeastern Wisconsin. The invitation-only tournament runs for a week and consists of 3 divisions containing 84 total teams, including both "A" and "B" teams (64 girls teams in 2 divisions and 20 boys teams in a single division). The Seton is unlike any other tournament most players will experience in middle school, and it is a great way for the 8th graders to cap their school careers! FUN FACT - Of the 42 championships awarded (3 divisions each year), 25 different schools have won. St. Mary's Menomonee Falls has won 7 banners, with Holy Apostles taking home 6. Three schools have won 3 championships (Christ King, St. Boniface, and St. Francis Borgia), and five schools have won 2 championships (Waukesha Catholic, St. Mary's Burlington, St. Mary Visitation Elm Grove, St. Leonard, and St. Dominic). Fall MAP testing results will be coming home with your child today. MAP testing is one data point that we use to help teachers know what concepts students have mastered, are ready to learn, and what needs to be reinforced. Please contact us if you have any questions or concerns about your child's results. Conferences, October 27 & 28 - Students will have school on Thursday, October 27th as conferences will be held in the evening on Thursday. There will be no school

for students on Friday, October 28 as conferences will take place during the day. Our middle school conference spots filled up quickly, so if you need a conference time and cannot find a spot open on the signup, please reach out to the teacher to set something up.


