Dear Families,

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced yesterday that FULLY VACCINATED individuals no longer need to wear masks in most situations. While this is exciting news, this announcement has raised several questions. We are consulting with the Waukesha County Health Department (WCHD) and several physicians in our school community to determine if it is prudent for us to change any of our mitigation strategies for the last 18 days of school. More information regarding our policies will be forthcoming.

We will be bringing back our K3 program in the 2021-22 school year and I am happy to announce that Mrs. Kim Schmitt has accepted this position. Besides being a busy mother of three, Mrs. Schmitt has been teaching preschoolers at the Menomonee Falls Coop, sub-teaching for us, and completing her level one training in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program. We are very blessed to have her join our school faculty!

Sadly, we will have to say goodbye to a few staff members as they move on to new opportunities. Mrs. Decker has resigned her position to stay home with Hudson, the newest addition to her family. Her part-time resource position will be expanded to full-time for the 21-22 school year. Mrs. Kosmecka has accepted a full-time position at the seminary and will be leaving at the end of this school year. Mr. Demeter has accepted a teaching position at DSHA and will also be leaving us at the end of the school year. While it is hard to say goodbye to these awesome teachers, I am extremely grateful for the time they have been at St. Mary and for all they have given to their students. Over two years ago, our application for Exemplary Recognition, in the area of mission and Catholic identity, was accepted by the Archdiocese.
