Dear Families,

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee is committed to creating environments that foster our children to live, learn, and grow in their faith. Since 2005, the children and youth in our Catholic schools have been receiving lessons regarding how to recognize behaviors or situations that make them uncomfortable and how to react when they feel unsafe.

These lessons serve to provide the framework to develop the language and skills to start the conversation between children and adults on safety. Last summer, Archbishop Listecki approved the use of the Circle of Grace curriculum. The goal of the Circle of Grace program is to educate and empower children and young people to prevent child abuse. Your child's teacher will be sending home a parent flyer with grade specific information when the Circle of Grace lessons are taught. I encourage you to read through this important information and check out some of the parent resources.


