Dear Families,

We have made it through our first full week of virtual learning. Give yourselves a pat on the back as this is no easy task! Hopefully, this change over has not been too stressful for you or your children. All teachers have been asked to reach out to their students and parents for feedback regarding how things are going, so we can continue to make improvements. Parents of students in grades 6-8 are asked to <u>click on this link and complete a brief survey</u>. It is difficult to determine if teacher expectations are too much, too little, or just right without being with the kids to see how independently they are able to complete tasks and how long it is taking them to complete tasks. This is what makes your feedback and the students' feedback so important to us. Please, take a minute or two to share your thoughts with us. We want to make this the best experience possible for the kids and for you!

As you may have heard there have been some security issues with Zoom calls that are quite alarming. Our teachers, like many others across the nation, are relying on these tools to interact with their students. We have taken the following measures to protect our students:

- All teachers have received direction on how to set the privacy settings on Zoom Meetings. They have also been given the option to use Google Meet. Google Meet has fewer options but is more secure since it is managed under our school domain.
- To keep video calls private, teachers are asked not to post the meeting ID on any social media. I would ask that parents and students not post the meeting ID or password on social media as well. Teachers will be giving students a password to join the meeting. Once the meeting begins, they can lock it so no one can unexpectedly join.

Scrip Update: As long as the parish office is able to maintain open hours, Scrip will continue to be ordered. The next few processing days are April 6, April 20, and May 4. If you are paying by check, please make sure your check arrives at the parish office by 8:00 on the processing day. If you have a Scrip order to pick up, consider calling the parish office first (262-251-0220). Although the office is committed to being open regular hours, we know how quickly things can change. St Mary's has decided to extend the Scrip processing year by one month, until May 31. This means that you have until May 31, instead of April 30, to meet your fundraising requirement and earn rebates toward next year's tuition. Going forward, future Scrip earning periods will run from June 1 through May 31. As always, PrestoPay and e-gift-cards are a great way to earn Scrip without leaving the house. Be safe!
