Special Congratulations to Mia B. and Isla J. - World Qualifying Irish Dancers!



Mia B. and Isla J., 5th Graders at St. Mary Parish School, achieved an amazing feat this past weekend, something only 1% of Irish dancers in the world are able to accomplish: they each earned a spot to compete in the World Championships for Irish Dance! This is the first year they were able to qualify, and because of their hard work and determination, they will now be competing in Glasgow, Scotland in March!

Mia and Isla both dance for Bellator Academy of Irish Dance in Germantown. Mia and Isla's moms, Marie and Heather, shared a bit more about the competitions that led to this special moment. "They competed at their regional competition this weekend called 'Oirechtas,' which happens once a year. Our mid-America region is made up of 14 states and known to be one of the most competitive regions in the entire world."

They shared that in Mia and Isla's age group, there were only 106 dancers who qualified to even be at regionals. Of those dancers, 1/3 qualified for nationals championships in July, and only 14 dancers qualified for World championship. Isla and Mia were that small percent that qualified for Worlds!

As far as training, Marie and Heather shared it's definitely not always easy and a lot of time and hard work for the girls. They each have dance class three days per week and do private lessons to help advance their technique. On top of that, Mia and Isla do personal training to keep their bodies strong and build strength, adding up to a minimum of 12 hours dedicated to Irish Dance each week.



They have to work hard to have a strong mentality to help with the competition portion of dance which is often very intense. At these major competitions, they have 5 judges watching them and scoring them all throughout all three dances. Dancers spend their whole career trying to even qualify for Worlds, and Isla and Mia were able to do it all at the age of ten!

On behalf of the St. Mary Community, we are so proud of your accomplishments! Congratulations to you both!
