

Dear St. Mary's Families,





<u>Director of Teaching: From the Desk of Mrs.</u> <u>Mogilevsky:</u>

At our School Advisory Meeting this week, I shared the findings of our comprehensive literacy review, which revealed inconsistencies in K-5 reading and writing instruction and a need for more professional learning for teachers. Over the past year, we established a Literacy Leadership Team, used the Wisconsin Curriculum Crosswalk Tool to guide our next steps in literacy shifts, and secured a \$25,000 "Love One Another" grant for literacy resources. Teachers are engaging in structured literacy training focused on best practice strategies, with ongoing professional development to ensure effective literacy instruction for all students. After careful evaluation and piloting, we are excited to implement Being a Reader and Being a Writer by Collaborative Classroom to strengthen our reading and writing instruction in K-5, while continuing to use Fundations for phonics. Teachers will participate in training and ongoing collaboration to ensure a strong, research-based approach to literacy instruction. This work aligns with our mission statement by promoting academic excellence through evidence-based literacy practices, supporting diverse learners with a program designed to meet the needs of all students, and seeing Jesus in every person by fostering a community where each child is valued and supported. We are excited about the growth ahead for our students as we build a stronger, more cohesive literacy program.


