Dear Parents,

The eighth-grade students did a spectacular job this afternoon re-enacting the Stations of the Cross from Mary's perspective. If you were not able to join us for the livestream, click here to watch the recording.

By now you have probably heard about the CDC's recommendations with respect to social distancing in schools. The change is aimed at providing a safe framework for schools that have struggled to open. While this is exciting news, it is important to understand that the context for this recommendation is to allow schools to reopen. It is not to be implemented across the board without careful consideration especially for schools, like ours, that have already applied successful mitigation and safety procedures. Waukesha County's case count and the percentage of COVID-19 positive cases have placed our county at a "high" level of concern by the State's metrics and these factors, along with spring break, may make any potential shift in strategy complicated. The CDC continues to emphasize that whenever possible, six feet of social distancing is recommended.

Please know that despite this change to classroom social distancing guidance, the CDC's definition of a "close contact" has not changed. This means that we will still need to contract trace for exposures to a confirmed case within six feet for 15 minutes or more.

We have received a couple of questions from parents who are confused about standards -based grading, so I am going to begin re-publishing information that was shared with you over the last couple of years. I highly encourage you to begin by reading or rereading the Parents Guide to Standards-based Grading. This guide was put together by our archdiocese and is specific to our system of grading. There are several different approaches to standards-based grading so if you are asking around, it can get a little confusing. For example, some schools consider a score of "4" to be mastery. Our grading system considers a "4" to be a level of mastery that goes significantly above and beyond the expectation of the standard. Please review the guide and contact your child's teacher or me if you have any questions.
